Thank you to David Knight and members of St. Francis Choir for leading us this evening with voice & music.

- It is our custom to observe silence in the church prior to the start of the service.
- The community of Taizé, in France, is the location of a teaching and contemplative retreat center that attracts thousands of believers from all over the world. Time is spent chanting, praying and studying. Our service of Wholeness and Healing emulates the style of the chant services at Taizé, with music from Taizé and other contemplative sources. We sing short phrases repeatedly to quiet our minds and hearts and open our souls to being in the presence of God.
- We invite you to join in as you need: singing, praying, and listening. We are glad you are here to sense God's presence with us.
- A bell will be rung at the beginning and end of the service. Please observe silence until you are outside the church. This will keep the sanctuary quiet for those who wish to remain in prayer.

- Please join us for light refreshments after the service, either outside on the Chapel Patio, weather permitting (turn right as you leave the church), or in the Board Room (turn left).

- We pray for those whose hearts are hurting; we pray for those in the midst of grief; we pray for those suffering from depression, anxiety or fear; we pray for those who are gravely ill; we pray for their caregivers; we pray for those who are severely injured physically, emotionally or spiritually; we pray for those who are in despair and don't know where to turn. May You bless them with a path forward; may You connect them to people who will walk with them; and may You grant them a resilience and an inner resolve they didn't even know they had, leading to the Peace which passes all understanding even in the midst of their trials. *Response*

We pray for those who seek You. May You bless them with Your palpable, loving presence when they knock; may they bask in the blessing of knowing You, loving You, following You. And we pray for those who do not yet know You. May they become curious to ask; may they be inspired to seek; may their hearts be opened and their souls filled. *Response* 

**LEADER** We are grateful for the gift of this new year and pray that we may not take one single day for granted. *Response* 

May we continue to seek and to find You in our lives, regardless of our circumstances. May You continue to work Your Goodness within every disappointment, setback, regret and heartache we experience. You know what we most need. We lift it all up to You and, in doing so, may we relieve ourselves of the burdens we are shouldering and trust in Your provision. We pray this through Your Son Jesus Christ. Amen.


Long Period of instrumental music for private or intercessory prayer.
