The Altar Guild prepares the church for worship each Sunday. They set up everything needed for Holy Eucharist, make sure that there are flowers on the altar, and that the candles are full of oil. They decorate the church for Christmas and Easter, putting a lot of thought, time and energy into making beautiful displays. The Altar Guild also cleans and irons all of the linens used during the service, clean and polish all the silver used in the service and store it securely. If you enjoy the ritual of the service and are detail oriented, this is the group for you.

Christian Life

Again, this is an umbrella term that covers a lot and could truly cover everything we do. For this booklet, we are limiting it to Taizé, Good Grief, and SAGES:

Taizé: This a meditative prayer service held on the fourth Tuesday of every month, modeled on the services held in Taizé, France. It is held in the chapel with hundreds of candles, making it a very holy and somber space.

Good Grief: This is a support group for people who are grieving: a death in their family, a family member with a debilitating illness, the loss of a job, spouse or friend, or just having a rough go of life in general.

SAGES: Senior Adult Group of Episcopalians is for people who are retired or able to go out during the day. We play Bunco, go to museums, have cookouts, and talk about how wonderful it is to be retired or not have to work during the day.

Scholarship Fund

The mission of SFOSF (St. Francis Outreach Scholarship Fund) is to help students of limited means with their unmet college expenses. Our organization is celebrating our 26th year. Our goal is to help students through all four years of college until graduation. The students must stay in touch with us and provide us with their grades and updates on their classes. We do not promise assistance but help and mentor them as appropriate.

We are at this time a group of 6 parishioners, and we will have a new mentor this year. We always welcome new members and mentors. Many of these students are first-generation college students and don't have much guidance in their home situation.

In fall 2023, we helped 7 new college freshmen. Most of them needed laptops as they use school computers which they need to turn in at the end of high school. We also assisted students from previous years, sophomores through those in their senior year. We disbursed \$18,803 in 2023 to support our student's needs, including tuition (covering unsubsidized loans), laptops, books, and other study materials.

We are so proud of our students and so grateful for the support provided by the Parish in our fundraising efforts.
